A Generic Operational Memory Model Speci£cation Framework for Multithreaded Program Veri£cation

Abstract

Given the complicated nature of modern architectural and language level memory model designs, it is vital to have a systematic approach for specifying memory consistency requirements that can support veri£cation and promote understanding. In this paper, we develop a speci£cation methodology that de£nes a memory model operationally using a generic transition system with integrated model checking capability to enable formal reasoning about program correctness in a multithreaded environment. Based on a simple abstract machine, our system can be con£gured to de£ne a variety of consistency models in a uniform notation. We then apply this framework as a taxonomy to formalize several well known memory models. We also provide an alternative speci£cation for the Java memory model based on a proposal from Manson and Pugh and demonstrate how to conduct computer aided analysis for Java thread semantics. Finally, we compare this operational approach with axiomatic approaches and discuss a method to convert a memory model de£nition from one style to the other.
